Celebrate Independence Day at Red, White, and Blue on the Green!

Summerville's favorite summertime tradition

SUMMERVILLE, S.C. (Wednesday, June 20, 2018) – The Town of Summerville will hold its annual Red, White, and Blue on the Green Independence Day celebration on Wednesday, July 4, 2018 at Gahagan Park, located at 515 W. Boundary St. The family-friendly event will feature live music, food vendors, and a fireworks display at dark. Festivities begin at 6 p.m. and end after the fireworks display. The event is free to the public.

Onsite parking at Gahagan Park is extremely limited. Handicapped parking will be available directly next to the event in the front lot located off of W. Boundary St. Additional parking is also available in the rear football field (enter from front of Gahagan Park, exit onto Butler St.) and the open field behind Plantation Playground (enter from and exit onto W. Boundary St.).

Parking is not permitted along Butler St. or W. Boundary St.

Attendees are encouraged to carpool to the event or park offsite and ride the shuttles provided. Offsite parking and shuttles will be available at each of the locations listed below. Shuttles will run constant loops between offsite parking locations and Gahagan Park starting at 5 p.m. and continuing through 10 p.m.

- Town Hall Parking Deck (Short Central, Summerville)
- Bethany United Methodist Church (118 W. 3rd S. Street, Summerville, East Side Only)
- Rollings Middle School of the Arts (815 S. Main Street, Summerville)
- John McKissick Field (S. Magnolia Street, Summerville)

Attendees are encouraged to bring lawn chairs, blankets, umbrellas, and water. Attendees can bring small lunch box-sized personal coolers - large coolers are not permitted. **Pets, tents of any size, personal fireworks, grills of any type and alcohol are not permitted.**

“Red, White, and Blue on the Green has become a tradition for many Summerville families,” Colin Martin, Summerville Town Administrator, said. “It’s a great way to bring the community together to celebrate our nation’s independence.”
