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Message:

This Addendum No. 1 modifies the solicitation only in the manner and to the extent as stated herein.

- Q1: The ITB requires the Contractor to be responsible to collect, load and haul debris (burnable and non-burnable) to a TDSRS site for reduction and then we will be required to haul reduced debris to a final disposal site based on a 25 mile haul. The bid sheet found on page 26 of 46, however, does not have a line item for the final haul out. Will you please clarify if we are to include final haul out of debris with our bid. If it is required to be included please add a line item for this service OR clarify which line item will include the final haul out of debris.
- A1: **A bid item has been included on the bid sheet on page 26 of 46, item #5, Final Haul out of Debris (new bid sheet included at the end of the addendum)**
- Q2: The ITB states that the contractor will collect and provide documentation required to ensure reimbursement for disposal fees by FEMA. Please clarify that we are to interpret this to mean that disposal fees/tipping fees will be billed to the town as a direct pass thru with no markup per FEMA guidelines thus the disposal fees should not be included in our stated bid price.
- A2: **Correct, tipping fees are a direct pass through in invoicing.**
- Q 3: Bid Item 4 – Please confirm that the hourly rate for Emergency Road Clearance will be an hourly rate PER CREW.
- A3: **Hourly rates for Emergency Road Clearance are Per Crew.**

- Q4: Bid Item 7 – Please confirm that the hourly rate for Demolition will be an hourly rate PER CREW Hourly
- A4: **Rate for Demolition is Per Crew**
- Q5: Bid Item 8 – Please clarify Hazardous Material. Are you referring to RACM material from the Demolition work or Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) or Bio-waste from the debris collection work. If you are referring to HHW would you consider changing the unit of measure to that of PER POUND to better satisfy FEMA guideline policy.
- A5: **This bid item covers all possible types of Hazardous waste mentioned in the question. The Hazardous Material bid item unit is changed to pounds.**
- Q6: Will each pricing proposal be analyzed and refined to become one total number which can then be compared to the other proposals, and if so, what is the formula that will be used to derive that total number?
- A6: **All unit prices will be added together to develop a sum. The sum of each proposal will be compared against each other to determine the lowest cost proposal.**
- Q7: Will some of the line item prices offered be excluded from the pricing evaluation? If so, which line items will be included and which will be excluded?
- A7: **All unit prices will be added together to develop a sum. The sum of each proposal will be compared against each other to determine the lowest cost proposal.**
- Q8: Will extended totals (unit price multiplied by estimated quantity) be used to evaluate pricing, and if so, what estimated quantities and what line items will be used to derive the extended totals that will be evaluated?
- A8: **All unit prices will be added together to develop a sum. The sum of each proposal will be compared against each other to determine the lowest cost proposal.**
- Q9: Will all pricing line items be evaluated equally or will some line items receive more importance in the evaluation? If some line items will be evaluated as more important, what is the formula that will be used to weight the importance of each line item?
- A9: **All unit prices will be added together to develop a sum. The sum of each proposal will be compared against each other to determine the lowest cost proposal.**
- Q10: Has the Scope of Work, under this new solicitation, remained the same, decreased, or increased compared to the current contract?
- A10: **The scope has remained the same as the current contract.**
- Q11: What is the total contract value of all option years, including base year, for the current contract?

**A11: Value of the contract is dependent on work performed,**

Q12: Who is the current incumbent?

**A12: The current incumbent is Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. and the secondary contractor is Crowder Gulf**

Respondent shall acknowledge receipt of this addendum by completing this section and returning it with the Bid Submittal. Failure to acknowledge this addendum may be cause for rejection.
